With their first pick in the 2008 NFL Draft, the Chargers tabbed Jim Thorpe Award winner cornerback Antoine Cason from the University of Arizona with the 27th overall choice.

A shutdown corner in the mold of former Arizona standout and current Baltimore Raven, Chris McAlister, Cason became the first Arizona player to earn All-Pac-10 Conference defense and special teams accolades in the same season. A likely first-round choice had he elected to come out following his junior season, Cason decided to return to the University of Arizona for his senior season so that he could stay on track to graduate with his class. He's now just one three-unit elective shy of earning a degree in political science from the U of A and will very soon receive his diploma.

Cason comes from a family rich in sports tradition. His father, Wendell, was a defensive back at the University of Oregon (1981-84) and went on to play for the Atlanta Falcons (1985-87). He now runs a trucking business in Southern California. Antoine's brother, Dione, ran track at Washington State. His cousin, Ken-yon Rambo, was a receiver at Ohio State (1997-00) before playing for the Dallas Cowboys (2001-02) and New York Jets (2003). And another cousin, Aveion Cason, was an All-America tailback at Illinois State (1997-00) and currently plays for the Detroit Lions (2001-02, 2006-present) after previously seeing stints with the St. Louis Rams (2001, 04-05) and Cowboys (2003)



earlier in his career. Last season, Antoine was in the stands at Qualcomm Stadium watching his new team beat Aveion's Lions, 51-14. All told, more than a dozen of Cason's family members have Division I college football experience.

Cason was a four-year starter for the Wildcats. He intercepted 15 passes during his career and shattered the school's record by racking up 349 yards in returns. He earned a host of postseason honors and accolades along the way, including the 2007 Jim Thorpe Award as the nation's top defensive back. As one of the fastest players on campus, he also starred on the Arizona outdoor track team for two years, competing in sprints and relays.

During his four seasons in Tucson, Cason also became a leader in the community. On behalf of the University, he donated time to community service projects and even filmed a public service announcement for the school. His largest endeavor was joining forces



with former Wildcats teammate, Matt Brooks, to create a campaign known as "Cason Cares." It's a project that Antoine decided to take on after losing his grandfather, Royce Rambo, to cancer in February 2006, while Brooks had several of his own family members affected by the disease. The goal of Cason Cares was to raise money for cancer research. Cason and Brooks sold rubber wristbands for \$3 apiece and the pair made a generous donation to the American Cancer Society before an Arizona men's basketball game at the McKale Center in December 2007.

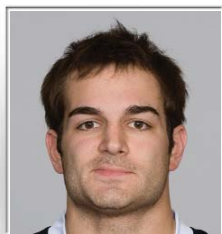

The Chargers opened Day 2 of the 2008 NFL Draft by trading up to the third round, to the 69th overall selection, to acquire running back Jacob Hester from LSU. The Chargers swapped picks with the New England Patriots, sending a fifth-round choice (160th overall) in the '08 draft and the Bolts' second-round



pick in 2009 to pick up the former Tiger. Hester will play both running back and fullback for the Chargers. He also played both positions at LSU, where he helped lead the Tigers to the 2007 BCS National Championship in his final collegiate game. As a senior, Hester rushed for 1,103 yards and 12 touchdowns, and as an adept receiver, he caught 14 passes for 106 yards and another score during his senior campaign. A starter his final two seasons at LSU, Hester finished his career with 20 touchdowns on the ground. He's a sure-handed ball-carrier, fumbling just once during his collegiate career while rushing for 1,780 yards on 364 carries and averaging nearly five yards per carry in the very tough Southeastern Conference.

A fan-favorite in Baton Rouge because of his "do it all" attitude, Hester had one of the biggest games of

his career as a senior against rival Florida. In front of the largest-ever crowd at Tiger Stadium, which approached 93,000, Hester scored on a two-yard run on a fourth-and-goal play with just over a minute remaining in the game to help the top-ranked Tigers erase a 10-point fourth-quarter deficit and top the ninth-ranked Gators, 28-24. Hester finished the night with 106 yards rushing, his first-career 100-yard game, and he converted two fourth-downs, including the game-winning score, on the Tigers' final drive. That performance against Florida earned him College Football Player of the Week honors from the Sporting News and Player of the Week honors from the SEC.

Mature beyond his years, Hester married the former Katie Tilley on July 28, 2007, proposing to her outside War Memorial Stadium in Little Rock, Arkansas, moments after LSU beat the Razorbacks, 31-26, in 2006. Hester kept his nerves that day by sticking to his traditional pregame ritual of listening to his Elvis Presley CD. Katie is the niece of former Miami Dolphins standout wide receiver Pat Tilley and Hester is a distant cousin of Hall of Fame quarterback Terry Bradshaw.

In the fifth round of the 2008 NFL Draft, the Chargers added another big and powerful running back, landing Marcus Thomas from the University of Texas-El Paso. The draft selections of Thomas and Jacob Hester will help the Chargers fill the void left by Michael Turner, who signed with the Atlanta Falcons in March 2008 as an unrestricted free agent. Thomas finished his career as the Miners' fifth all-time leading rusher (2,615 yards) and third-leading scorer (26 rushing touchdowns). He also ranked fourth in

100-yard games (11) and seventh in all-purpose yards (3,660). As a senior, Thomas rushed for 1,166 yards and 16 touchdowns while averaging over five yards per carry (5.1). He racked up a school-record seven 100-yard games and became only the fourth player in school history to score more than 100 points in a season and only the seventh to rush for more than 1,000 yards. The Chargers made Thomas the 166th overall selection in this year's draft.

In the sixth round of the 2008 NFL Draft with the 192nd choice, San Diego added another ball-hawking cornerback in DeJuan Tribble, a two-time All-Atlantic Coast Conference pick from Boston College. A speedster at 5-9 and 190 pounds, Tribble tied a Boston College record with three interception returns for touchdowns, while his 15 career picks were the third-most in Eagles' history. A Boston College player

hadn't returned three picks for touchdowns in a career since the early 1960s. Twice Tribble had three interceptions in a game, performing the feat against Miami as a junior and against Wake Forest as a senior.

Antoine Cason, the Chargers' first-round pick, and Tribble, their sixth-rounder, combined to pick off 30 passes as collegians while playing in two of the NCAA's top conferences, the Pac-10 and the ACC.
